TRUMPET CALL

There are several exciting new developments for the Celebration Challenge. Below are some reports and explanations of these developments.

We now have a website to help connect, relay vision, and communicate between houses of prayer. Check it out at <u>http://www.trumpetcall2nations.com</u> and send us your suggestions. We pray it will help service the Celebration Challenge efforts in building and connecting houses of prayer.

We are also working with other missions and prayer ministries in a new initiative, "Inherit the <u>Nations.</u>" Information can be found on our website. The purpose of the initiative is to link houses of prayer with unreached/untouched people groups. Missions organizations, primarily the Center for World Missions, have identified 250 people groups that when reached would cover 90% of the unreached in the world. The purpose of this initiative is to link houses of prayer with these groups.

Each house of prayer would adopt one of the people groups to pray for over the next year. We are also trying to link the houses of prayer with present missionaries reaching these groups. More information can be found on our website under the "**Inherit the nations initiative**."

We have also launched a "<u>Strategic Alert System.</u>" The purpose of this initiative is to develop a communication system that can send out key alerts quickly and handle sensitive information securely.

We just returned from the "Trumpet Call Myanmar" conference held January 6-9 in Yangon, Myanmar. Part of the vision for the Celebration Challenge is to raise up houses of prayer where they do not exist and strengthen those desiring to build. It was a distinct privilege to go to a nation desiring to build their worship expression.



The focus of the conference Amos 9:11 was on and "Raising up David's Tent." Representatives came from all over Myanmar. The trumpet is truly sounding. All there were precious and hungry people. The nation is ripe for a turning. Those who are crying out to the Lord are relentless. Youth on fire...older generation carrying tremendous wisdom...you can see it in their eyes. Weeping worship leaders and teams brought us into the holy of holies. By the end of the

conference the whole place was rocking.

During soaking time on the second day, a young Baptist youth pastor came running forward for testimony. He said during the first 15 minutes he sat and saw or heard nothing. Then suddenly an angel appeared, touched him and said "Wake up!" He brought the testimony. Over the ensuing lunch hour he had more revelation. In the afternoon session, we had him open up in prayer. He fell to his face behind the podium and prayed a fervent prayer for the gathering. The atmosphere truly shifted through the testimony.

As people engaged with the Lord, there were testimonies of healings. There were powerful messages and sessions with music and singing scriptures. There was a final exhortation to not turn back but take hold of the horns of the altar, answer the cries of heaven, and not give up. The



conference ended with the leadership team of the conference being anointed by those of us from outside. They then turned to anoint the conference attendees. Those of us from other nations stood behind them to pray as a representation of the nations in agreement. Over the past 5-6 decades, many have felt isolated in Myanmar. We declared they were no longer isolated. The session ended with glorious praise, worship and dancing. At the closing dinner, there was a distinct sense of family amongst all there.

Again, hard to express all that happened, but the love of the Lord abounded. It was an unforgettable time with new found friends. We are coming back changed and humbled.
